FIDA 38th Convention 2024 Resolutions

The 38th Convention of the International Federation of Women Lawyers (FIDA) held in Cali, Colombia from the 4th – 8th November 2024. Nine countries were represented at the convention, and we had 12 plenary sessions discussing very topical issues that affects the mission and vision of FIDA, they include:

- Rape Within Marriage
- Neurological Orphaned Illnesses
- The Gift Economy
- Artificial Intelligence and the Role of Women
- Pension Reform in Comparative Law
- New Masculinities
- Sustainable Development Goals
- Empowerment and Inclusion of Women
- Violence Against Women in the Ranks
- Femicide
- Webcam Models, Legal Status, and Issues
- Quota Law and Women's Rights Participation in Government

On the topic on Rape Within Marriage, FIDA resolved that governments and International Organizations should -

- **Criminalize marital rape** globally, ensuring that it is recognized as a form of sexual violence and punishable by law.
- implement legal frameworks to protect victims of marital rape, ensuring they have access to justice and support services.
- provide support in enacting and enforcing laws that criminalize marital rape.

On Neurological Orphaned Illnesses:

- **Governments** should adopt policies that bridge the gap in access to treatments for orphan diseases, particularly neurological conditions, ensuring **equitable healthcare** for all.
- International organizations should support research and development for orphan diseases, promoting global collaboration to ensure that no one is left behind in accessing life-saving treatments.

FIDA discussed the topic 'The Gift Economy' and resolved that:

- **Governments** should adopt policies that embrace the **Gift Economy**, prioritizing mutual care and non-exploitative economic systems.
- International organizations must work toward the criminalization of ecocide and the development of legal frameworks that protect vulnerable populations and the environment from exploitation.

On the issue of Artificial Intelligence and the Role of Women -

- **Governments** must ensure **inclusive policies** that promote women's equal participation in AI and technological development.
- **Legal frameworks** should be established to protect privacy rights, prevent job. **displacement**, and **ensure gender equity** in the technological sector.
- International organizations like UNESCO and UN Women should support initiatives that integrate women's perspectives into the ongoing technological revolution.

The resolutions agreed on at the Session on Pension Reform in Comparative Law are that:

- Governments should reform pension systems to eliminate gender disparities, ensuring equal retirement benefits for all genders and recognizing the value of unpaid labor, particularly caregiving.
- International organizations such as the International Labour
 Organization (ILO) should assist in developing equitable pension

systems that support all individuals, particularly women and caregivers.

On the issue of New Masculinities, the Convention resolved that:

- Governments should create education programs that promote new masculinities based on empathy, equity, and emotional intelligence.
- International organizations should support global efforts to dismantle toxic masculinity and promote gender inclusivity through cultural shifts and policies.

On Sustainable Development Goals

- Governments must increase the representation of women in political, social, and economic spheres to ensure that the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) are achieved in a gender-equitable manner.
- **Women's leadership** in governance must be promoted to ensure that policies affecting women's rights, development, and sustainability are prioritized.
- International organizations should continue to advocate for gender justice as a fundamental element of achieving sustainable development.

In discussing Empowerment and Inclusion of Women, FIDA resolved that:

- Governments should enhance programs aimed at empowering women, including youth development, community engagement, and workforce inclusion.
- International organizations should expand efforts to support disabled women, providing skill acquisition programs and fostering economic independence.
- Policies should integrate feminist principles with environmental stewardship, promoting the connection between gender equality and sustainability.

On Violence Against Women in the Ranks

- Governments must strengthen legislation and enforcement mechanisms to combat violence against women, especially within organizations and institutions.
- Access to justice, healthcare, and support services for survivors should be **expanded** to ensure protection and recovery.
- International organizations must support gender equality initiatives and hold perpetrators accountable, ending impunity and promoting women's involvement in peacebuilding efforts.

In discussing Femicide, FIDA resolved that:

- Governments should implement measures to empower women through education and economic opportunities.
- **Provide safe spaces** for women affected by violence and **ensure access** to psychological support and counseling services.
- International organizations must advocate for regular training on gender-based violence for legal professionals and create programs to educate women on identifying red flags in relationships to prevent femicide.

The convention addressed Webcam Models, Legal Status, and Issues and resolved that:

- Governments should recognize webcam modeling as legitimate work and implement labor protections for those involved, ensuring fair wages, workplace safety, and legal safeguards against exploitation and violence.
- International organizations, including FIDA, should advocate for legal frameworks that protect the rights of webcam models and ensure their work is framed in a human rights context.

Quota Law and Women's Rights Participation in Government

- Governments must introduce and enforce gender quotas to ensure equal representation of women and men in political and legislative spaces.
- Affirmative action measures should be implemented to move beyond women's development to women-led development, empowering women to take on leadership roles and influence national and international policy.
- International organizations should support governments in creating inclusive political structures that promote gender parity and women's active participation in decision-making processes.
